Course description

The “Project for Building Disaster-Resilient and Sustainable Societies in Latin America (Kizuna II)” aims to strengthen disaster risk management capacities and encourage effective management, in line with the principles established in the Sendai Framework and the objectives of the Kizuna II Project, which looks to foster the development of resilient societies in the countries of the Latin America and Caribbean region. Within this framework, the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) in collaboration with the National Disaster Prevention and Response Service (SENAPRED) and the Chilean International Cooperation Agency for Development (AGCID) have developed the “Community-based Disaster Risk Management Plans” training programme for professionals and/or representatives of Disaster Risk Management institutions in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Course objectives

Professionals and representatives of DRM institutions in Latin America and the Caribbean will strengthen the skills they need for the design, development and/or updating of Local/Community Disaster Risk Reduction Plans (DRR) and Emergency Plans (EP), as instruments for local Disaster Risk Management planning.

Classes

Class 0: Introduction and welcome.

Class 1: Context of Disaster Risk Management (DRM) Plans.

Class 2: Community-based Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) Plan.

Class 3: Community Emergency Plan (EP).

Class 4: Community Hazard Plan.

Class 5: Master Class: Best practices in Community-based Disaster Risk Management Plans.
Experience of another country in the region.

Class 6: Conclusion and certification.

Class 6	
- Conclusion and certification	- No assessment. Participants must complete the Satisfaction Survey.

Methodology

The course will be taught via an asynchronous e-learning format consisting of four (4) self-directed working modules and one (1) synchronous Master Class, in which participants will be provided with an introductory overview and conceptual examination of the topic along with practical work.

Each module will present the proposed topic by means of content capsules and downloadable materials to allow participants to delve deeper into topics of interest. The self-directed study process will be accompanied by formative assessments to confirm participants have understood the teaching materials.

Final and passing grades for the course will be determined from the weighting of the summative assessments that correspond to each work module (1 to 4) of the asynchronous course, together with the participation in the Master Class and completion of the Satisfaction Survey.
